- the Steering Group works with the four Round Tables that each concentrate on one important and inter-related aspect that determines how the City is now and how it can develop in the future: social issues; environment; economy and culture
- is the Local Strategic Partnership that the Government expects to prepare a community plan for Norwich that will identify and deliver the most important things which need to be done, keep track of progress and keep up-to-date

Raising the aspirations of young people and their families, especially in the more deprived communities of Norwich, and extending the opportunities available to them so that they can participate in all areas of the economy and participate fully in the quality of life that the City can offer.

The four Round Tables have each:

- explored and debated the current position in Norwich for their special area of interest
- considered the City's strengths and weaknesses
- identified what they feel are the most important actions to take to improve things now and in the future.

The work that the Round Tables have done so far is summarised on some of the following display boards and there are copies of the draft plans that they are producing.

The fictional life stories of Patrick and Yasmin, that are also set out on display boards, illustrate how action on the various priorities can combine to make

a positive impact on the future of people and the City as a whole.
