Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) **THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

HEARTSEASE ROUNDABOUT – 1) Harvey Lane from its junction with St Williams Way/ Plumstead Road Roundabout for 48m southwards; **2) Plumstead Road East** from its junction with St Williams Way/ Plumstead Road Roundabout for 30m north eastwards; **3) Margetson Avenue** from its junction with St Williams Way for 20m southwards; and **4) Plumstead Road** into the ALDI superstore carpark to facilitate works for the Transforming Cities Scheme. This Order continues the provisions of the Order dated 25th August 2023 that the roads 1,2 and 3 will be temporarily closed (except for access) and the no right turn restriction at road 4 will be temporarily suspended. These restrictions will now continue in effect from 25th April to 18th May 2024 (previously 11th September 2023 to 24th April 2024). Alternative route is via: 1. Harvey Lane, Yarmouth Road, Thunder Lane, St Williams Way and vice versa; 2. Plumstead Road East, Woodside Road, Salhouse Road, Heartsease Lane and vice versa; and 3. Margetson Avenue, Gordon Avenue, Pilling Road, St Williams Way and vice versa.

SOUTHWELL ROAD - from its junction with Milton Close to its junction with Trafalgar Street to facilitate speed bump replacement and carriageway patching works from 22nd to 24th April 2024. Alternative route is via: Southwell Road, Hall Road, Trafalgar Street.

(ii) **THEY HAVE MADE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING POINT INSTALLATION (2) - 1) Bury Street from 25m north west of its junction with Newmarket Street for 38m north westwards (northern side only); 2) Dereham Road from 40m east of its junction with Midland Street for 20m eastwards (northern side only); 3) Durham Street from 5m northeast of its junction with Onley Street for 20m north eastwards (southeastern side only); 4) Earlham Road from 79m east of its junction with Heigham Road for 39m eastwards (southern side only); 5) Gloucester Street from 10m southeast of its junction with Rupert Street for 22m south eastwards (north eastern side only); 6) Mill Hill Road from 170m north of its junction with Park Lane for 25m northwards (eastern side only); 7) Mount Pleasant from 10m east of its junction with Unthank Road for 20m eastwards (southern side only);); 8) Walpole Street from 36m southeast of its junction with Vauxhall Street for 58m south eastwards (north eastern side only); and 9) Portersfield Road from 5m west of its junction with Portland Street for 18m westwards (southern side only); in the CITY OF NORWICH to facilitate installation of electric vehicle charging points. This Order continues the provisions of the Order dated 9th February 2024 that traffic usings the roads will be temporarily prohibited from parking, stopping and loading/unloading vehicles and the restriction will now continue in effect from 13th April to 11th May 2024 (previously 12th February to 12th April 2024). N.B For the avoidance of doubt, 6) Midland Street and 9) Onley Street are not subject to the continuation of these restrictions.

NEWMARKET ROAD - from its junction with Elveden Close for 100m north eastwards to facilitate tree maintenance works will be subject to the temporary suspension of the bus lane between 07:30 and 16:00 from 14th April 2024 to 21st April 2024 only when signs indicating the suspension are in place expected to be for one day only.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s). All other restrictions are included where necessary. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Alternative routes are shown where applicable and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. If necessary, the restrictions could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Orders or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
