TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH)
Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) **THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following road:

AYLSHAM ROAD - from its junction with A1024 Mile Cross Road for 25m eastwards to facilitate water meter replacement work from 12th to 13th December 2024 (may continue until 24th January 2025). Alternative route is via: A1402 Aylsham Road (North), A140 Reepham Road, A140 Cromer Road, A1402 Aylsham Road (South). (Hellesdon, Norwich). **NB. This restriction relates to the closure of the link road, which allows road users travelling Northbound to turn left on to the A1024 Mile Cross Road.**

(ii) **THEY HAVE MADE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

BUTTERMERE ROAD & PITCHFORD ROAD – 1) Pitchford Road from its junction with Buttermere Road for 15m northwards and 15m southwards and **2) Buttermere Road** from its junction with Pitchford Road for 15m westwards to facilitate repairs to utility cover between 07:30 and 17:00 on 3rd December 2024 (may continue until the 14th January 2025). Alternative route is via: Crummock Road, Wordsworth Road, Rockingham Road.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. **Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required.** The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months for vehicular highway or 6 months for non-vehicular highway.

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
