Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2025 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) **THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

CITY ROAD - from its junction with Bracondale to its junction with Corton Road to facilitate footway reconstruction works. The road will be temporarily closed and traffic over the road shall be temporarily prohibited to park, stop, load, and/or unload on both the east and west sides of the carriageway from 9th to 29th June 2025 (may continue until 10th August 2025). Alternative route is via: City Road, Long John Hill, Barrett Road, Hall Road, Queens Road and vice versa. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

COTMAN ROAD - from its junction with Ranson Road to 15m east of its junction with Heathside to facilitate water main repair works from 10th to 12th June 2025 (may continue until 24th July 2025). Alternative route is via: Westbound - Telegraph Lane East, Thorpe Road, Carrow Road, Clarence Road, Cotman Road. Eastbound - Cotman Road, Thorpe Road and Cotman Road. The works promoter is Anglian Water.

QUEEN STREET - from 1m east of its junction with Bank Plain to 1m west of Upper King Street to facilitate blockage clearing works between 19:00 on 9th June and 05:00 on 10th June 2025 (may continue until 22nd July 2025). Alternative route is via: Bank Plain, Upper King Street. The works promoter is Virgin Media.

ST AUGUSTINES STREET & PITT STREET – 1) St Augustines Street from its junction with Pitt Street to its junction with Aylsham Road and **2) Pitt Street** from its junction with St Crispins Road roundabout to its junction with St Augustines Street to facilitate carriageway patching works between 00:00 on 8th June and 06:00 on 9th June 2025 (may continue until 21st July 2025). Alternative route is via: St Crispins Road, Charlton Road, Bull Close Road, Magdalen Road, Sprowston Road, Mousehold Lane, Chartwell Road, Mile Cross Lane, Aylsham Road (Sprowston, Old Catton). The works promoter is Norfolk County Council. NB: Please note that Pitt Street will be closed northbound only.

WENSUM STREET - 40m north of its junction with Elm Hill to 35m south of its junction with Fishergate to facilitate new washout and tee installation works between 08:00 and 16:00 on 8th June 2025 (may continue until 20th July 2025). Alternative route is via: Northbound - Palace Street, St Martin at Palace Plain, Whitefriars, Barrack Street, Charlton Road, Steward Street, Bull Close Road. Southbound - Fishergate, Whitefriars, St Martin at Palace Plain, Palace Street and Wensum Street. The works promoter is Anglian Water.

(ii) **THEY HAVE MADE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

BARRETT ROAD - from its junction with Long John Hill to its junction with Loddon Road to facilitate carriageway reinstatement works from 2nd to 8th June 2025 (may continue until 20th July 2025). Alternative route is via: Barrett Road, Lakenham Road, Ipswich Road, Ipswich Road Southern Bypass Roundabout, A47, Loddon Road (Trowse with Newton, Keswick and Intwood, Caistor St. Edmund and Bixley). The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

BORROWDALE DRIVE - from its junction with Heartsease Lane for 10m westwards to facilitate footway reconstruction works from 2nd June to 25th July 2025 (may continue until 25th January 2026). Alternative route is via: A1042 Heartsease Lane, B1140 Plumstead Road, Hilary Avenue, Borrowdale Drive and vice versa. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

HALL ROAD - from 1m south of its junction with Queens Road to 45m north of its junction with Harford Street to facilitate carriageway patching works between 19:00 and 23:00 from 4th to 5th June 2025 (may continue until 17th July 2025). Alternative route is via: Northbound - Hall Road, Lakenham Road, Ipswich Road, St Stephens Road, St Stephens Roundabout, Chapel Field Road, St Stephens Street, Queens Road. Southbound Diversion - Queens Road, St Stephens Street, Chapel Field Road, St Stephens Road, St Stephens Road, Ipswich Road, Lakenham Road, Hall Road. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

PELHAM ROAD - from 15m east of its junction with Norman Road for 10m eastwards to facilitate sink hole investigation and repair works from 3rd to 13th June 2025 (previously 13th May to 2nd June 2025) (may continue until 13th December 2025). Alternative route is via: St Clements Hill, Rosebery Road, Angel Road, Millers Lane, Pelham Road and vice versa. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required. The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
