

Norfolk County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (the "Order") (NTRO9755) affecting the A1242 Yarmouth Road from its junction with A1042 Ring Road for 20m westwards ("Road A") and A1042 Yarmouth Road from its junction with A1242 Yarmouth Road for 20m eastwards ("Road B") and A1042 Ring Road from its junction with A1242 Yarmouth Road for 20m northwards ("Road C") and A1242 Yarmouth Road from its junction with A1042 Ring Road to 30m west of its junction with Bungalow Lane ("Road D") in the Parish of Thorpe St. Andrew to facilitate carriageway improvement works, the Roads A-D will be temporarily closed/restricted (except for pedestrian access) for the duration of the works/period the closure is necessary which is anticipated to be from 21st July to 22nd August 2025 only whilst signs indicate closures are in place, but may continue to be closed/restricted until the 22nd February 2026 where the closure/restriction is still required beyond the anticipated dates.

NB – Roads A-C will be closed from 21st July until 22nd August. Road D will be closed from 11th August until 22nd August.

Alternative route is via: 1) A1242 Yarmouth Road/ Thorpe Road/ Carrow Road, A147 Carrow Road/ Koblenz Avenue/ King Street, A1054 Bracondale/ Martineau Lane, A146 Loddon Road, A47, A1270 Broadland Northway, A1042 Yarmouth Road. 2) A1042 Ring Road/ Saint Williams Way/ St Williams Way, B1140 Plumstead Road/ Ketts Hill, A147 Bishop Bridge Road/ Riverside Road/ Riverside/ Koblenz Avenue/ Canary Way/ Carrow Road, A1242 Clarence Road/ Thorpe Road/ Yarmouth Road (Thorpe St. Andrew, Norwich City, Postwick).

The works promoter for this restriction/closure is: Norfolk County Council.

Vehicular access will be permitted to a final destination in the Roads A-D where signs indicating such access is possible and permitted are in place.

The Order shall automatically revoke on the completion of the works/when the closure is no longer necessary or otherwise on the 22nd February 2026 without further notice.

If necessary, the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date the Order is effective.

A person who contravenes, or who uses or permits the use of a vehicle in contravention of the restriction/closure imposed by the Order shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.

In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance.
