Reason:
Space Studios has been trading with a Premises Licence since 2016. In the past 9 years we have built our reputation as a melting pot of creative talent in the Fine City and have achieved our initial aim of providing a much needed space for alternative creative arts events and local artists.
Our 18 art studios remain fully booked by local artists producing visual art. Our 2 creative spaces have never looked better (we do all the improvements ourselves) are now used by an ever wider range of local talent, including:
Our online radio station streaming a wide variety of music shows and promotion for local DJ talent.
Live local bands performing at the studios around 6 times per month. We are particularly proud of this due to the huge number of small grass roots music spaces which have closed nationally in the past 5 years, and the essential role this type of small capacity performance space plays in supporting local bands in their professional development.

Once a month we host a social-connection based event called Contact Hours – which is well attended and highly valued and has the unique purpose of connecting local arts graduates with

each other, to foster creative partnerships, increase social connections, reduce isolation, and enjoy making creative work together.

We host art exhibitions for local artists (one of only a very few places available for them), and have also provided space for local pop up markets for local makers, DJ workshops run by and for women and focussed on supporting minority groups, provided space for the launch of a number of new local street food traders (selling to customers at our music events), as well as getting 4 renowned local artists to come in and paint areas of the building with their distinctive art styles which remain in place semi permanently.

We now have over 5,000 people on our social media feeds and have become an established and much valued part of the creative arts scene in the city.

However, we remain a very small capacity venue, with a maximum capacity of 140 people, and we have always been limited by our 1am closing time. The fact is that on many of our music nights when we run a bar people often only come to us when the pubs close at 11pm – so we really only get a couple of hours of trading time.

Most of the profit we make, which enables us to provide a space for all the other types of uses of the building listed above, come from these two hours of trading. In this challenging time of rising costs (stock costs, staff employment costs, energy costs etc) we desperately need to trade for longer hours in order for the project to remain financially viable.

We have consulted with Michelle Bartram regarding the possibility of this and the feedback has been positive. Michelle and Mr Aston Martin have visited the premises to inspect our facilities and ensure they meet safety standards.

The demand and is there from our customers for us to trade for longer and we are confident (based on our excellent track record of very few disturbances in the building over nearly 10 years), that we can safely continue to uphold all four licensing objectives.

Due to the nature of the events we put on, nearly all of which are hosted by small groups of local creatives who are building up local followings of like minded people who enjoy their creative output: there is a 'friends of friends' feeling to events the premises which discourages anti-social people and behaviour.

To ensure this great track record continues, if our application is successful, additional door supervision, noise control measures and dispersal policies will be used to minimise public nuisance and maintain safety.

Variation 2 – Modify condition on door staff

Proposed change:

Modify this condition to read:

"SIA Door staff will be employed from 2100 hrs until close for any event on Friday and Saturday evenings involving alcohol. All other events will be risk assessed."

Reason:

The premises is used on some Tues, Wed and Thursday evenings, and occasionally on Sundays: but this is generally only our smaller space on the 3rd floor and these events are very low key and almost never reach the capacity limit of 60 people.

Most of these events have 30 people or less, and they are almost always small social groups. The admin work and the financial cost of booking security staff is significant – meaning these events rarely make any profits.

The customers in attendance are from the same social circles and we have never had a single incidence of anti-social or violent behaviour during the mid week. It seems entirely unnecessary to have expensive security staff on the door during the hours from 9pm.

Making this change would still ensure we have robust door supervision in place during higher risk periods on Friday and Saturday evenings. This change maintains the promotion of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder licensing objective, as door staff will be deployed when needed most.

How the Licensing Objectives will be upheld

Prevention of Crime & Disorder:

- SIA door staff would continue to be employed on all Friday & Saturday nights after 21:00.
- A door staff log will be maintained.
- CCTV remains in operation throughout the premises.

Public Safety:

- The venue capacity, fire safety measures and emergency procedures would remain unchanged.
- Staff would continue to be trained in safety and responsible alcohol retailing.

Prevention of Public Nuisance:

- Noise management measures are all in place: self-closing doors, sound limiters, and neighbour liaison.
- Late night dispersal policy to minimise noise when guests leave after 03:00.

Protection of Children from Harm:

• Age verification policy continues to apply for alcohol sales.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

The proposed extension of hours is accompanied by a comprehensive set of control measures designed to ensure that all four licensing objectives continue to be met. These include staff training, a detailed and regularly reviewed dispersal policy, responsible management of alcohol service and deployment of experienced SIA-accredited door staff during key hours. The premises has a proven record of managing risk effectively, and these controls will be strengthened under the variation.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- SIA-licensed door supervisors will be employed from 21:00 onwards every Friday and Saturday night. For higher capacity events, additional door staff will be deployed.
- A door staff log and incident log will be maintained.
- CCTV is fully operational throughout the premises and is regularly checked to ensure it is in good working order.
- All staff are trained in responsible alcohol retailing, conflict management, and identifying signs of intoxication or disorderly behaviour.
- A zero-tolerance approach to drugs and aggressive behaviour is enforced, with security checks carried out at entry.

c) Public safety

- Venue capacity is monitored in line with the fire risk assessment (maximum 140 persons).
- Emergency lighting and fire detection systems are tested regularly.
- First aid kits are available and first aiders are on-site during operating hours.
- Public liability insurance is in place and up to date.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- A robust dispersal policy is in place and followed, including staggered floor closures to encourage gradual customer departure and reduce noise impact.
- Decibel meters are installed and maintained to manage music levels.
- Staff and security proactively manage noise and liaise with customers to encourage quiet behaviour when exiting.
- External noise levels are regularly reviewed and monitored.

e) The protection of children from harm

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.

 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
