The City Council of Norwich (Residents Car Parks) (Cavalry Ride) Amendment Order 2025

The City Council of Norwich propose to make the above-named Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which will introduce permit parking on Cavalry Ride. Car parking on Cavalry Ride will only be available for motor vehicles displaying a valid parking permit. Car parking will be permit controlled for twenty-four hours a day Monday to Saturday. Residents of the properties 1-30 Don Pratt Court, 90-98 Mousehold Street and 1-15 Cavalry Ride would be eligible to apply for residents parking permits and visitor parking permits for parking at the Cavalry Ride car park area.

This order will amend The City of Norwich (Residents Car Parks) Order 1996 as amended (1996 Order)
