Conservation Area 11 : Bowthorpe

<u>Bowthorpe Hall</u> Cottages	
	Two semi-detached early 19C red brick cottages. Two storey with later single storey brick extension. Cottages constructed in Flemish board, tile roof, later metal, casement windows.
<u>St. Michael's</u> <u>Cottages</u>	Two 19C semi-detached cottages, 1 wall English board. Red brick and tile. 2-storey. Replacement wood casement windows. Front and rear elevations have dogtooth moulded cornice. Plain brick pilasters on rear elevation. At either side of cottages, 1980s brick and tile extension and pitched roof. 19C single storey shared brick rear extension.
<u>Stable Complex</u> (now workshops)	3-sided single storey around open courtyard. Buildings much altered and repaired. Right hand range, flint rubble construction with brick dressings; centre range, new timber weather- boarded front with windows and doors. Left hand range, red brick much patched. Complex has red pantiled roof and casement windows.
<u>The Barn</u>	19C red brick. Billet moulded cornice. Asymmetrical roof. Crow stepped gables. Two entrances sealed with block and brick. Ventilation slits with drip mouldings. Small lozenge window in gable end. Tie irons, later single storey brick and tile extension to rear.
