

Lived uring: on St Crispins Road you'll find what is said to be the oldest surviving example of a prefabricated concrete urinal in the UK, now a Grade II listed building, dating back to 1919.

Wenrum Park: opened in 1925 as part of a public works programme to create jobs, it boasts two children's play areas and a paddling pool – as well as a riverside area to feed ducks!



Prince of Denmark: at this pub you can gaze up at the impressive relief mural of the Prince of Denmark, produced in 1939 by John Moray-Smith.

by Bishop Herbert de Lozinga as the St Mary Magdalen Leper Hospital, located outside the city walls to minimise the risk of contagion.




Norwich Prizon: this route takes you past Britannia Barracks, built in 1887 as the home of the Norfolk Regiment and now part of Norwich Prison. Great views across the city from Café Britannia.

Royary Cemetery: founded in 1821 as the UK's first non-denominational cemetery. A real gem as well as a wildlife haven within the city.



Dragon Hall: a unique medieval merchant trading hall, dating from around 1430. 




