Partnership arrangements

Within specific partnership agreements, Norwich City Council contributes funding to:

- Norfolk Community Law Service - £5,000 to reduce the number of public sector tenancy possession cases reaching court proceedings, through a partnership arrangement with the County court, by offering mediation services to help prevent eviction.
- Norfolk and Norwich Festival - £120,000.00 to support provision of a diverse and inclusive annual programme of events. This is a significant arts organisation within the East of England and provides opportunities for greater collaboration with local, national and international partners.
- Norwich Arts Centre - £37,000.00 to support provision of a broad range of performing and media arts to the community. The Centre offers a range of participatory workshops and activities that offer good access to the arts.
- Norwich Fringe Project - £9,696 to protect and improve wildlife and archaeological sites in areas accessible to the general public. The Project supports work within local communities to manage the countryside around Norwich.
- Visit Norwich - £63,000 to market the area locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. VisitNorwich is a private/public sector partnership partly funded by Norwich City Council and South Norfolk Council.
- Writers Centre Norwich - £37,800.00 to support provision of a range of performing and media arts to the community and pioneer collaborative projects with writers and other partners. The Centre led the successful bid for Norwich to become England's first UNESCO City of Literature- one of only six cities in the world to hold the title.
