The effect of the Order will be to divert the length and width of that part of Half Mile Road Footpath Between 54 and 56 to Glenmore Gardens (4F175/10) commencing at point A on the Order Map (grid reference: TG 21915 10636) and proceeding in a generally northernly direction for a distance of approximately 18 metres to point B on the Order Map (grid reference: TG 21921 10653) and then continuing in a generally easternly direction for a distance of 11 metres to point C on the attached map (grid reference: TG 21931 10650) and create an alternative footpath being 3 metres wide and commencing at point A on the Order Map (grid reference: TG 21915 10636) and continuing in a generally easternly direction for 13 metres to terminate where it meets Glenmore Gardens (U41420) at point D on the Order Map (grid reference: TG 21928 10637).

This Order comes into force on the date on which Norfolk County Council certify that the terms of Article 2 of the Order have been complied with but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or that of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to that Act.
