

**Norfolk County Council
Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders 2023 (Norwich City)
Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984**

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

CARROW ROAD - from its junction with Geoffrey Watling Way to its junction with Kerrison Road to facilitate stage building works from 2nd to 9th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Carrow Road, Canaryfields, Geoffrey Watling Way and vice versa.

HALL ROAD - from its junction with Mansfield Lane to its junction with St. Johns Close to facilitate carriageway patching works between 09:00 and 16:00 from 29th May to 2nd June 2023, only while signs indicating the closure are in place. NB. The closure will only be in place for one day between the above dates. Alternative route is via: Hall Road, Barrett Road, Mansfield Lane and vice versa.

HELLESDON HALL ROAD - from its junction with Low Road for 30m eastwards to facilitate Norfolk County Council wall repair works from 5th to 9th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Hellesdon Road, Low Road, Hospital Lane, Drayton High Road, Sweet Briar Road, Hellesdon Hall Road and vice versa (Norwich, Hellesdon).

JAMIESON PLACE 1 - footpath Norwich 4F506 from its junction with Jamieson Place to its junction with Knowland Grove to facilitate fibre installation works from 30th May to 6th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Knowland Grove, Jamieson Place Footpath to Knowland Grove, Jamieson Place and vice versa.

JAMIESON PLACE 2 - footpath Norwich 4F507 from its junction with Jamieson Place to its junction with Knowland Grove to facilitate fibre installation works from 7th to 12th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Knowland Grove, Jamieson Place and vice versa.

MARKET AVENUE AND FARMERS AVENUE - 1) Market Avenue into Castle Meadow; and **2) Farmers Avenue** from its junction with Castle Meadow for 30m southwards to facilitate tree care works. The road 1) will be temporarily subject to a no left turn restriction; and 2) will be subject to the temporary suspension of the pedestrianised zone between 08:00 and 16:00 on 28th May 2023. Alternative route is via: 1) Rose Lane, Cattle Market Street and Farmers Avenue; and 2) N/A. **NB. The suspension of the pedestrianised zone on Farmers Avenue is to accommodate the diversion route for Market Avenue.**

MARTINEAU LANE (Slip Road) - from its junction with Martineau Lane to its junction with A146 Loddon Road to facilitate carriageway surfacing works between 19:00 and 23:00 on 8th or 9th June 2023, only while signs indicating the closure are in place. Alternative route is via: Martineau Lane, Barrett Road, Hall Road/Barrett Road roundabout, Barrett Road, A146 Loddon Road.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

BRITANNIA ROAD - from its junction with Wolfe Road for 30m northwards to facilitate Anglian water maintenance works from 23rd to 25th May 2023. Alternative route is via: Wolfe Road, Quebec Road, Ketts Hill, Britannia Road.

DEREHAM ROAD - from its junction with Grapes Hill to its junction with Douro Place (westbound only) to facilitate sewer development works from 22nd May to 2nd June 2023. Alternative route is via: Barn Road, Grapes Hill, Convent Road, Unthank Road, Earlham Road, Farrow Road, Guardian Road. HGV

Alternative route - Grapes Hill, Chapelfield Road, St Stephens Road, Newmarket Road, Mile End Road, Colman Road, Farrow Road, Guardian Road Dereham Road.

DOVER STREET AND ONLEY STREET - 1) Onley Street from its junction with Unthank Road for 10m south-eastwards; and **2) Dover Street** from its junction with Unthank Road for 10m north-westwards; to facilitate utility cover repairs between 19:00 on 23rd and 07:00 on 24th May 2023. Alternative route is via: 1) Onley Street, Durham Street, Gloucester Street, Unthank Road and vice versa; and 2) Dover Street, Portersfield Road, Portland Street, Unthank Road and vice versa.

KING STREET - 1) from 47m northeast of its junction with Stuart Road for 37m north-eastwards; and **2)** from 67m northeast of its junction with Stuart Road for 57m north-eastwards; to facilitate building maintenance works using a cherry picker. The road 1) will be temporarily closed (except for access); and traffic using the road 2) will be temporarily prohibited from parking, stopping and loading/unloading vehicles on 21st May and 4th June 2023. NB: The second date will only be used in the event that the works are not completed on the first date. Alternative northbound route is via: Carrow Road, Koblenz Avenue, Riverside, Prince of Wales Road, Rose Lane, Cattle Market Street, Rouen Road and King Street; and alternative southbound route is via: King Street, Rouen Road, Cattle Market Street, Market Avenue, Prince of Wales Road, Riverside, Koblenz Avenue, and Carrow Road.

NEWMARKET ROAD ON-SLIP ROAD CYCLE PATH - from its junction with Bluebell Road to its junction with Newmarket Road to facilitate telecoms maintenance works from 25th May to 1st June 2023, only when signs indicating the closure are in place. No alternative route is available. Cyclists will be asked to dismount and use available footway.

VALENTINE STREET AND GOLDING PLACE - 1) Golding Place footpath for its entire length; and **2)** parking bay on **Valentine Street** to facilitate structure safety restoration works. The Order continues the provisions of the Notice dated 3rd May 2023 that 1) the footpath will be temporarily closed (except for access); and 2) traffic using the road will be temporarily prohibited from parking, stopping and loading/unloading vehicles. The restriction will continue in effect from 24th May to 2nd November 2023 (previously 3rd to 23rd May 2023). Alternative route is N/A.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s). All other restrictions are included where necessary. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Alternative routes are shown where applicable and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. If necessary, the restrictions could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Orders or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
