TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2023 (NORWICH)
Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

BANK STREET - from its junction with Upper King Street to its junction with Bank Plain to facilitate shop glass replacement works between 07:00 and 18:00 on 18th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Upper King Street, Prince of Wales Road, St Vedast Street, Rose Lane, Market Avenue and Bank Plain.

BARRACK STREET AND BARGATE COURT - 1) Barrack Street into Bargate Court; and **2) Bargate Court** into Barrack Street; to facilitate power cable installation works. The roads 1) and 2) will be temporarily subject to a no right turn restriction from 19th to 23rd June 2023. Alternative route is via: 1) Barrack Street, Barrack Street/St Crispins Road Roundabout, Barrack Street and Bargate Court; and 2) Bargate Court, Barrack Street, Barrack Street/Ketts Hill Roundabout and Barrack Street.

BARRET ROAD - (westbound only) from 100m east of its junction with Hall Road Roundabout to its junction with Hall Road Roundabout to facilitate telecommunication works between 19:00 and 05:00 from 20th to 23rd June 2023. Alternative route is via: Barrett Road, Martineau Lane, Loddon Road, Southern Bypass, A47 J A146 Join W, A47 Through J A146 W, A47 From J A146 To J A140 W, Norwich Southern Bypass, A47 Through J A140 W, A47 J A140 Leave W, Ipswich Road Southern Bypass Roundabout, Ipswich Road, Lakenham Road (Caistor St. Edmund and Bixley, Trowse with Newton, Keswick and Intwood).

CANARY WAY - from its junction with Koblenz Avenue for 10m eastwards to facilitate Traffic Signals Replacement works between 19:00 and 06:00 from 19th to 21st June 2023, only while signs indicating the closure are in place. Alternative route is via: Westbound – Canary Way, Carrow Road, Clarence Road, Thorpe Road, Harvey Lane, Plumstead Road, Ketts Hill, Bishop Bridge Road, Riverside Road, Riverside and Koblenz Avenue. Eastbound - Koblenz Avenue, Riverside, Riverside Road, Bishop Bridge Road, Ketts Hill Roundabout, Bishop Bridge Road, Riverside Road, Thorpe Road, Carrow Road and Canary Way (Thorpe St. Andrew).

JAMIESON PLACE 4 - footpath Norwich 4F504 from its junction with Jamieson Place to its junction with Knowland Grove to facilitate fibre installation works from 21st to 28th June 2023. The closure will be clearly indicated on site. Alternative route is via: Jamieson Place, Knowland Grove and vice versa.

MELROSE ROAD - from its junction with Mile End Road for 50m south-westwards to facilitate Openreach overhead cable works between 09:30 and 15:30 on 20th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Melrose Road, Upton Road, Newmarket Road, Mile End Road.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

HELLESDON HALL ROAD - from its junction with Low Road for 30m eastwards to facilitate Norfolk County Council wall repair works from 5th to 9th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Hellesdon Road, Low Road, Hospital Lane, Drayton High Road, Sweet Briar Road, Hellesdon Hall Road and vice versa (Norwich, Hellesdon).

JAMIESON PLACE 2 - footpath Norwich 4F507 from its junction with Jamieson Place to its junction with Knowland Grove to facilitate fibre installation works from 7th to 12th June 2023. Alternative route is via: Knowland Grove, Jamison Place and vice versa.

MARTINEAU LANE (Slip Road) - from its junction with Martineau Lane to its junction with A146 Loddon Road to facilitate carriageway surfacing works between 19:00 and 23:00 on 8th or 9th June 2023, only while signs indicating the closure are in place. Alternative route is via: Martineau Lane, Barrett Road, Hall Road/Barrett Road roundabout, Barrett Road, A146 Loddon Road.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s). All other restrictions are included where necessary. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Alternative routes are shown where applicable and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. If necessary, the restrictions could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Orders or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
