Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2023 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

FRESHFIELD CLOSE FOOTPATH - from its junction with Larkman Lane to its junction with Freshfield Close to facilitate UK Power Networks link box replacement works from 6th to 9th November 2023. Alternative route is via: Larkman Lane, Earlham Green Lane, Malbrook Road, Freshfield Close and vice versa.

HUMBLEYARD - from 40m south of its junction with Rawley Road for 20m southwards to facilitate Anglian Water metre exchange works between 08:00 and 14:00 on 8th November 2023. Alternative route is via: Humbleyard, Clover Hill Road, Rawley Road.

LOWER CLARENCE ROAD - from the west side of its junction with Stracey Road, westwards for a distance of 242m to a point 55m south of its junction with Thorpe Road to facilitate the staging of football matches at Carrow Road Stadium and the safe travel of fans attending those matches from 5th November 2023 to 30th April 2024, only on those days when a football match is being held at Carrow Road Stadium and only while signs indicating the closure are in place expected to be up to 6 hours on each match day. Alternative routes will be signed on site for the duration of the restrictions.

MELROSE ROAD - from its junction with Mile End Road for 30m westwards to facilitate exchange of link box works from 8th to 10th November 2023. Alternative route is via: Melrose Road, Leopold Road, Unthank Road, Mile End Road

RAMPANT HORSE STREET - from its junction with St Stephens Street to its junction with Brigg Street to facilitate mobile crane works between 19:00 and 06:00 from 5th to 6th November 2023, only while signs indicating the closure are in place. Alternative route is via: Rampant Horse Street, Theatre Street, Chapel Field North.

SILVER ROAD - from its junction with Barrack Street for 25m northwards to facilitate meter exchange works between 09:00 and 14:00 on 5th November 2023. Alternative route is via: Barrack Street, Ketts Hill, Gurney Road, Mousehold Avenue.

SPROWSTON ROAD - from its junction with Lawson Road for 40m northwards to facilitate cover framework repair works from 6th to 8th November 2023. Alternative route is via: N/A.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

ALL SAINTS GREEN AREA - 1) Millennium Plain from its junction with St Peters Street to its junction with Hay Hill; 2) Hay Hill from its junction with Millennium Plain to its junction with Gentleman's Walk; and 3) All Saints Green from 21m north of its junction with Surrey Street for 13m northwards on the north-western side of the carriageway only to facilitate works relating to the remodelling of the Hay Hill area. This Order continues the provisions of the Order dated 12th January 2023 that the roads 1) and 2) will be temporarily closed (except for access) and the restriction will now continue in effect from 4th November 2023 to 29th February 2024 (previously 23rd January to 3rd November 2023); and that traffic using road 3) will continue to be temporarily prohibited from parking, stopping and load/unloading vehicles in effect from 6th November 2023 to 29th February 2024 (previously 17th January to 5th November 2023). Alternative route is via: 1) St Peters Street, Gaol Hill and Gentleman's Walk; 2) Millennium Plain, St Peters Street, Gaol Hill and Gentleman's Walk; and 3) N/A.

DORIS ROAD - from its junction with Park Lane for 250m westwards to facilitate Norfolk County Council carriageway works from 2nd to 3rd November 2023. Alternative route is via: Park Lane, Parker Road, Pembroke Road, Doris Road and vice versa.

DOVER STREET - from its junction with Unthank Road for 30m north-westwards from 31st October to 2nd November 2023. Alternative route is via: Unthank Road, Park Lane, Avenue Road, Portersfield Road and vice versa.

HEARTSEASE LANE & SALHOUSE ROAD - 1) Heartsease Lane from its junction with Salhouse Road to its junction with Rider Hagard Road; 2) Salhouse Road (northbound only) from its junction with Heartsease Lane for 124m north-eastwards; and 3) Salhouse Road onto Heartsease Lane to facilitate high voltage connection works. The road 1) will be temporarily subject to a 30mph speed restriction between 19:00 and 07:00 from 7th November to 8th December 2023; 2) will be closed (except for access) between 19:00 and 07:00 from 1st to 8th November 2023; and 3) will be temporarily subject to a no left turn restriction between 19:00 and 07:00 from 1st to 8th November 2023, only while signs indicating the closure are in place. Alternative route is via: 1) N/A; 2) Alternative northbound route - Heartsease Lane, St Williams Way, Thunder Lane, Plumstead Road East, Woodside Road and Salhouse Road; and 3) Salhouse Road, Mousehold Lane, Sprowston Road/Wroxham Road roundabout, Mousehold and Heartlease Lane.

NEWMARKET ROAD SCHEME (PHASE 3) - Newmarket Road from its junction Daniels Road/ Newmarket Road Roundabout to its junction with Claremont Road to facilitate Norfolk County Council pedestrian and cycling resurfacing works between 20:00 and 06:00 from 30th October to 17th November 2023. Alternative route is via: A11, A47, A140 Ipswich Road, Daniels Road (Caistor St. Edmund and Bixley, Ketteringham, Hethersett, Cringleford, Keswick and Intwood).

THE AVENUES - from its junction with Bluebell Road for 55m eastwards to facilitate telecoms installation works between 08:00 and 18:00 on 28th and 29th October 2023. Alternative route is via: Bluebell Road, North Park Avenue, Colman Road, The Avenues and vice versa.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s). All other restrictions are included where necessary. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Alternative routes are shown where applicable and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. If necessary, the restrictions could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Orders or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
