Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:-

i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order in respect of the following road:

GLADSTONE STREET - from its junction with Dereham Road for 30m southwards to facilitate electrical installation works from 15th to 17th January 2024. Alternative route is via: Dereham Road, Heigham Road, Stafford Street, Gladstone Street and vice versa.

ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

DEREHAM ROAD – from its junction with Stafford Avenue to a point 275m west of its junction with Norwich Road for Norfolk County Council works to facilitate Transforming Cities Scheme. The road will be temporarily subject to a 20mph speed restriction from 8th January 2024 to 31st July 2024 for the duration of the works. Alternative route is N/A.

QUAYSIDE – from its junction with Wensum Street to its junction with Pigg Lane to facilitate water pipe repair works from 10th to 12th January 2024. Alternative route is via: Wensum Street, Palace Street and Pigg Lane.

ST. STEPHENS STREET –at its junction with Surrey Street to allow buses to access the bus station during works on Queens Road. The road will be temporarily subject to a suspension of the right-turn restriction from 8th January to 19th April 2024. Alternative route is N/A.

UNTHANK ROAD – (northeast bound) at the roundabout with Convent Road to facilitate water meter exchange works from 19:00 on 11th to 07:00 on 12th January 2024. Alternative route is via: Unthank Road, Earlham Road, Farrow Road, Guardian Road, Dereham Road, Grapes Hill, Convent Road.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s). All other restrictions are included where necessary. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Alternative routes are shown where applicable and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. If necessary, the restrictions could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Orders or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
