Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) **THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

ESSEX STREET - from its junction with Unthank Road to its junction with Rupert Street to facilitate utility works from 22nd January to 19th February 2024. Alternative route is via: Unthank Road, Convent Road, Grapes Hill, Chapel Field Road, Vauxhall Street, Rupert Street and vice versa.

JUNCTION ROAD - from its junction with Berners Road for 20m southwards to facilitate sewer works between 19:00 on 22nd and 06:00 on 23rd January 2024. Alternative route is via: Junction Road, Drayton Road, St Martins Road, Aylsham Road.

LEOPOLD ROAD - from its junction with Newmarket Road for 45m north westwards to facilitate works to install an electrical link box from 22nd to 26th January 2024. Alternative route is via: Leopold Road, Melrose Road, Upton Road and Newmarket Road.

ROSARY ROAD - from 50m south of its junction with Chalk Hill Road for 80m southwards to facilitate works to complete a meter exchange between 18:00 and 23:00 on 25th January 2024. Alternative route is via: Rosary Road, Thorpe Road, Carrow Road, Canary Way, Koblenz Avenue, Riverside, Riverside Road.

(ii) **THEY HAVE MADE** a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order in respect of the following road:

GLADSTONE STREET - from its junction with Dereham Road for 30m southwards to facilitate electrical installation works from 15th to 17th January 2024. Alternative route is via: Dereham Road, Heigham Road, Stafford Street, Gladstone Street and vice versa.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s). All other restrictions are included where necessary. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Alternative routes are shown where applicable and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. If necessary, the restrictions could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Orders or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
