

NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL has made a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (CTRO868) affecting the Lower Clarence Road from its junction with Thorpe Road for 50m southwards in the CITY OF NORWICH to facilitate split collar main repairs.

This Order continues the provisions of the Notice dated 27<sup>th</sup> February that the road will be temporarily closed (except for access) and the restriction will now continue in effect from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> March 2024 (previously 1<sup>st</sup> February to 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024) for the duration of the works expected to be about 7 days within the period.

Alternative route is via: Alternative southbound route – Thorpe Road, Carrow Road, Clarence Road and Lower Clarence Road

Alternative northbound route - Lower Clarence Road, Clarence Road and Thorpe Road.

If necessary, the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Order.

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.

In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance.
