Food Hygiene

Summary:

Food hygiene standards are excellent. You demonstrated full compliance with legal requirements. You have safe food handling practices and procedures and all the necessary control measures to prevent cross-contamination are in place. (Score 0)

Structure and Cleaning

Summary:

The structure, facilities, cleaning and maintenance are all of a good standard and only minor repairs and/or improvements are required. Pest control and waste disposal provisions are satisfactory. The minor contraventions require your attention. (Score 5)

- 2. The following items could not be effectively cleaned and must be covered or made non-absorbent (Contravention):
 - Several surfaces were made of unsealed wood e.g. cupboard doors, loft access covers, surround to counter refrigerator, these should be painted or sealed.
- 3. I was pleased to find that the premises was clean and has been refurbished to a high standard. (Observation)

Confidence in Management

Summary:

A food safety management system is in place and you demonstrate a very good standard of compliance with the law. Food hazards are understood, properly controlled, managed and reviewed. Your staff are suitably supervised and trained. There are some minor contraventions which require your attention. (Score 5)
