1. Food Hygiene and Safety

Food hygiene standards are high. You demonstrated a very good standard of compliance with legal requirements. You have safe food handling practices and procedures and all the necessary control measures to prevent cross-contamination are in place. Some minor contraventions require your attention. (Score 5)

Contamination risks

Observation Contamination risks were controlled

Hand-washing

Observation Hand washing was managed well and the wash-hand basin in the preparation area was well stocked with hand cleaning material. However there was no soap or towel to the wash hand basin to the upstairs washing up area

Personal Hygiene

Observation I was pleased to see that standards of personal hygiene were high.

Temperature Control

Observation I was pleased to see you were able to limit bacterial growth and/or survival by applying appropriate temperature controls at points critical to food safety and that you were diligently monitoring temperatures.

2. Structure and Cleaning

The structure facilities and standard of cleaning and maintenance are all of a good standard and only minor repairs and/or improvements are required. Pest control and waste disposal provisions are adequate. The minor contraventions require your attention. (Score 5)

Cleaning of Structure

Contravention The following structural items were dirty and require more frequent and thorough cleaning:

- the flooring under where the cookies are stored
- the flooring near the bin to the upstairs kitchen
- stairs leading to the upstairs kitchen
- widowsill upstairs in the top storeroom

Cleaning of Equipment and Food Contact Surfaces

Contravention The following surfaces and equipment in contact with food were dirty and/or could not be cleaned and require cleaning or discarding:

- the seals to all of the Daewoo fridge freezers
- the cooler to the post mix dispenser
- the groove to the front of the display cabinet

Recommendation I recommend that you number the fridge freezers

Cleaning Chemicals / Materials / Equipment and Methods

Observation I was pleased to see that the premises was kept clean and that your cleaning materials, methods and equipment were able to minimise the spread of harmful bacteria between surfaces.

Observation I was pleased that sanitiser conforms to British standards and that it is changed daily

Maintenance

Contravention The following items had not been suitably maintained and must be repaired or replaced:

• split seals to the Daewoo freezer

Facilities and Structural provision

Observation I was pleased to see the premises had been well maintained and that adequate facilities had been provided.

3. Confidence in Management

A food safety management system is in place and you demonstrate a very good standard of compliance with the law. Food hazards are understood properly controlled managed and reviewed. Your records are appropriate and generally maintained. Your staff are suitably supervised and trained. You have a good track record. There are some minor contraventions which require your attention. (Score 5)

Training

Observation I was pleased to see that food handlers and/or managers had been trained to an appropriate level and evidence of their training was made available.

Infection Control / Sickness / Exclusion Policy

Guidance Public Health England recommends that food handlers known or suspected to be suffering from a food-borne infection or gastrointestinal illness stay away from work until symptom-free for 48 hours.

Allergens

Observation You had identified the presence of allergens in your non-prepacked food and had brought this to the attention of your customers.
