What you must do to comply with the law

1. Food Hygiene and Safety

Food hygiene standards are high. You demonstrated a very good standard of compliance with legal requirements. You have safe food handling practices and procedures and all the necessary control measures to prevent cross-contamination are in place. Some minor contraventions require your attention. (Score 5)

Contamination risks

Contravention The following exposed food to the general risk of physical contamination with dirt or foreign objects:

- use of cardboard boxes to store prepared foods in the freezer
- foods in freezer not properly wrapped (e.g. stock)

Hand-washing

Contravention The following evidence indicated hand-washing was not suitably managed:

• staff were washing hands at the sink not at the designated hand wash basin

Personal Hygiene

Observation I was pleased to see that standards of personal hygiene were high.

Temperature Control

Observation I was pleased to see you were able to limit bacterial growth and/or survival by applying appropriate temperature controls at points critical to food safety and that you were diligently monitoring temperatures.

Poor Practices

Observation The following matters represented poor practice and if allowed to continue may cause food to become contaminated or lead to its deterioration

• two containers of pate were found, part used, and past the best before date (19.08.2018).

2. Structure and Cleaning

The structure facilities and standard of cleaning and maintenance are of a generally satisfactory standard but there are some repairs and/or improvements which are required in order for you to comply with the law. Pest control and waste disposal provisions are

adequate. The contraventions require your attention; although not critical to food safety they may become so if not addressed. (Score 10)

Cleaning of Structure

Contravention The following structural items were dirty and require more frequent and thorough cleaning:

• the corridor between the kitchen and front of house (flooring under the bench, hand contact surfaces, wall tiles, door seals to fridge and freezer)

Maintenance

Contravention The following items had not been suitably maintained and must be repaired or replaced:

- the sealant behind the sink in corridor
- wall tiles above window in kitchen
- wall tiles in desert area (corridor)
- holes to walls in dried goods store
- hand contact surfaces including handles of containers (cleaning chemicals)
- shelves in the vegetable fridge

3. Confidence in Management

A food safety management system is in place and you demonstrate a very good standard of compliance with the law. Food hazards are understood properly controlled managed and reviewed. Your records are appropriate and generally maintained. You have a good track record. There are some minor contraventions which require your attention. (Score 5)

Proving Your Arrangements are Working Well

Contravention The Management sections in your Safer food Better Business (SFBB) pack are intended to demonstrate you are in day-to-day control of the hazards to food. The following Management sections were either missing, incomplete or not up-to-date:

- Staff training records
- cleaning schedule needs to cover the desert area (corridor) and bar area.
