Contraventions relating to structural repairs, your food safety management system and staff training, should be completed within the next <u>2 months</u>.

Health and safety contraventions should be dealt with within <u>3 months</u> unless otherwise stated.

To assist you the report may also include **Observations** of current practice, useful **Information**, **Recommendations** of good practice and reminders of **Legal Requirements**.

My inspection was not intended to identify every contravention of the law and only covers those areas, practices and procedures examined at the time of the inspection. If the report fails to mention a particular matter this does not mean you have necessarily complied with the law.

## How we calculate your Food Hygiene Rating:

## 1. Food Hygiene and Safety

Food hygiene standards are high. You demonstrated a very good standard of compliance with legal requirements. You have safe food handling practices and procedures and all the necessary control measures to prevent cross-contamination are in place. Some minor contraventions require your attention. **(Score 5)** 

## Contamination risks

**Information** The FSA (visit www.food.gov.uk for more information) has issued guidance on controlling E.coli 0157 through:

- the complete separation of raw and ready-to-eat food
- the correct use of wash-hand basins and thorough hand washing
- having dedicated equipment (including complex equipment) for raw and ready-to-eat foods
- through 2-stage cleaning and the correct use of sanitiser
- and by controlling the risks posed by soily vegetables.

Observation Contamination risks were controlled.

**Observation** I was pleased you could demonstrate effective E.coli 0157 control through the complete separation of raw and ready-to-eat food, the correct use of wash-hand basins and thorough hand washing, having dedicated equipment (including complex equipment) for raw and ready-to-eat foods, through 2-stage cleaning and the correct use of sanitiser, and by controlling the risks posed by soily vegetables.

#### Hand-washing

**Recommendation** For extra protection against cross contamination use a liquid soap with disinfectant properties conforming to the European standard BS EN 1499: 1997. This information should be available on the product label or may be obtained from the supplier or manufacturer.

**Observation** Hand washing was managed well and wash-hand basins were well stocked with hand cleaning material.

#### Personal Hygiene

**Observation** I was pleased to see that standards of personal hygiene were high.

#### Temperature Control

**Observation** I was pleased to see you were able to limit bacterial growth and/or survival by applying appropriate temperature controls at points critical to food safety and that you were diligently monitoring temperatures.

**Recommendation** That cool boxes be used to transport high risk foods provided for packed lunches for trips, rather than transporting in a cardboard box.

## 3. Structure and Cleaning

The structure facilities and standard of cleaning and maintenance are all of a good standard and only minor repairs and/or improvements are required. Pest control and waste disposal provisions are adequate. The minor contraventions require your attention. (Score 5)

## **Cleaning of Structure**

**Contravention** The following structural items were dirty and require more frequent and thorough cleaning:

• wall by the bin near the salad sink. (I recommend a more durable wall finish be provided in this area.)

**Contravention** The following structural items could not be effectively cleaned and must be covered or made non-absorbent:

- wall surface by door to sport hall where something has been removed.
- odd areas of worn wall paint in the kitchen
- flaking paint to wall near extract hood above sink

• a few coloured indicator taps were missing. Replace as dirt was being harboured.

• runner at base window, where cobwebs and a dead insect were seen. Cleaning of Equipment and Food Contact Surfaces

**Observation** You had dedicated equipment for the preparation of raw and ready-to-eat foods.

**Observation** You had colour-coded equipment on which to prepare food.

## Cleaning Chemicals / Materials / Equipment and Methods

**Information** Ensure you use a surface sanitiser that conforms to BS EN 1276:1997 or BS EN 13697:2001. This information should be available on the label or by contacting the manufacturer.

**Information** A surface sanitiser may be rendered ineffective if you are not following the correct dilution or allowing a sufficient time for the product to work (contact time). Always follow the instructions on the product label.

**Guidance** Taps can be a source of contamination so use a paper towel to turn off the tap after washing and drying your hands.

**Observation** I was pleased to see that the premises were kept clean and that your cleaning materials, methods and equipment were able to minimise the spread of harmful bacteria between surfaces.

## Facilities and Structural provision

**Observation** I was pleased to see the premises had been generally well maintained and that adequate facilities had been provided.

## Pest Control

**Observation** I was pleased to see the premises were proofed against the entry of pests and that pest control procedures were in place.

## 3. Confidence in Management

A food safety management system is in place and you demonstrate a very good standard of compliance with the law. Food hazards are understood properly controlled managed and reviewed. Your records are appropriate and generally maintained. Your staff are suitably supervised and trained. You have a good track record. There are some minor contraventions which require your attention. **(Score 5)** 

## Type of Food Safety Management System Required

**Observation** Your SFBB/food safety management system was in place and working well. I was confident you had effective control over hazards to food.

**Observation** You were date labelling perishable foods appropriately and could demonstrate effective control over food spoilage organisms. **Observation** You had colour-coded equipment and effective separation between raw and ready-to-eat food at all stages in your operation.

**Observation** You were monitoring (and recording) the temperatures of your fridges and freezers well as the temperature of cooked/hot-held food and could demonstrate effective systems for controlling bacterial growth and survival.

#### **Traceability**

**Observation** Your records were such that food could easily be traced back to its supplier.

#### Waste Food and other Refuse

**Observation** You had measures in place to dispose of waste food appropriately and were employing the services of an approved waste contractor.

#### Training

**Observation** I was pleased to see that food handlers and/or managers had been trained to an appropriate level and evidence of their training was made available.

#### Infection Control / Sickness / Exclusion Policy

**Observation** Policies were in place to prevent any infected food handler from contaminating food.

#### <u>Allergens</u>

**Observation** You had identified the presence of allergens in your non-prepacked food and had brought this to the attention of your customers.

## HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE

#### Matters of evident concern

**Legal Requirement** Ensure equipment does not drip water onto the floor as this poses a slip hazard. Cloths were laid on the floor to soak up water, and in themselves formed a potential trip hazard.
