

**The City Council of Norwich  
(Residents Car Parks) (Cavalry Ride) Amendment Order 2026**

The Norwich City Council has made the above-named Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026 which comes into operation on the 19<sup>th</sup> January 2026. The effect of which will be the introduction of permit parking on Cavalry Ride. Car parking on Cavalry Ride will only be available where a valid parking permit is held (residents or visitors) and displayed in the motor vehicle where it is issued in physical form. Car parking will be permit controlled for twenty-four hours a day Monday to Saturday. Residents of the properties 90 – 98 Household Street and 1 – 15 Cavalry Ride will be eligible to apply for residents parking permits and visitor parking permits for parking at the Cavalry Ride car park area.

This order amends The City of Norwich (Residents Car Parks) Order 1996 as amended (1996 Order).

The order also clarifies for all parking places covered by the 1996 Order that the display of parking permits in motor vehicles is not required only where the Council have at their absolute discretion issued electronic parking permits only and no physical parking permit capable of being displayed has been issued. Where a physical parking permit is issued it must be displayed even if an electronic parking permit has also been issued.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks from 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026 apply to the High Court for this purpose
