

Norfolk County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (the "Order") (CTRO1422) affecting the Carrow Hill (parking bays southside of the carriageway) from 20 metres east of its junction with Bracondale for 20 metres eastwards (the "Road") in the City of Norwich to facilitate new gas connection works, traffic (constituting any class of vehicle) over the Road shall be temporarily prohibited to park, stop, load, and/or unload for the duration of the works/period the restriction is necessary which is anticipated to be from 9th to 11th February 2026, but may continue to be restricted until the 25th March 2026 where the restriction is still required beyond the anticipated dates.

Alternative route is via: N/A.

The works promoter for this restriction/closure is: Cadent.

Vehicular access will be permitted to a final destination in the Road where signs indicating such access is possible and permitted are in place.

The Order shall automatically revoke on the completion of the works when the restriction is no longer necessary or otherwise on the 25th March 2026 without further notice.

If necessary, the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date the Order is effective.

A person who contravenes, or who uses or permits the use of a vehicle in contravention of the restriction imposed by the Order shall be guilty of an offence.


Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.

In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance.
