TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2026 (NORWICH)
Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) **THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

CHARTWELL ROAD AND CONSTITUTION HILL - A) Chartwell Road from its junction with Spixworth Road to its junction with Sprowston Road **B) Constitution Hill** from its junction with Wall Road to its junction with School Lane to facilitate resurfacing of the roundabout between 19:00 and 06:00 from 18th to 27th March 2026 (may continue until 9th May 2026). Alternative route is via: **Road A:** Chartwell Road, Mile Cross Lane, Reepham Road, Cromer Road, Holt Road, Cromer Road, Broadland Northway, Wroxham Road, Sprowston Road. **Road B:** North Walsham Road, Broadland Northway, Wroxham Road, Sprowston Road, Magdalen Road, Bull Close Road, Charlton Road, Bull Close Road, Magdalen Road, Constitution Hill (Hellesdon, Beeston St. Andrew, Spixworth, Horsford, Rackheath, Sprowston, Old Catton, Horsham St. Faith and Newton St. Faith). The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

HEIGHAM STREET –from 1m east of its junction with Barn Road for 20m westwards to facilitate gas mains repairs from 16th to 18th March 2026 (may continue until 29th April 2026). Alternative route is via: 1) Westbound Diversion - Barn Road, St Crispins Road, Dereham Road, Old Palace Road, Heigham Street 2) East Bound Diversion - Heigham Street, Old Palace Road, Dereham Road, Barn Road. The works promoter is Cadent.

UPTON ROAD – from 40m south of its junction with Unthank Road for 30m southwards to facilitate footway surface repairs from 16th to 18th March 2026 (may continue until 29th April 2026). Alternative route is via: Waldeck Road, Leopold Road, Unthank Road and vice versa. The works promoter is Anglian Water.

WINCHCOMB ROAD - from 20m south of its junction with Dereham Road for 20m southwards to facilitate electrical works from 16th to 20th March 2026 (may continue until 1st May 2026). Alternative route is via: Dereham Road, Guardian Road, Winchcomb Road. The works promoter is UK Power Networks.

(ii) **THEY HAVE MADE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

BESSEMER ROAD – from its junction with White Lodge Business Estate to its junction with Gilchrist Close to facilitate telecoms pole works between 08:00 and 18:00 on 8th March 2026 (may continue until 19th April 2026). Alternative route is via: Hall Road, Bessemer Road, Sandy Lane and vice versa. The works promoter is Vodafone.

CAMBRIDGE STREET – A) Cambridge Street from its junction with Trinity Street to its junction with Rupert Street and **B) Cambridge Street** from its junction with Trinity Street to its junction with Rupert Street and **C) Cambridge Street** from its junction with Unthank Road to its junction with Rupert Street and **D) Cambridge Street** from its junction with Unthank Road to its junction with Rupert Street and **E) Cambridge Street** from its junction with Unthank Road to its junction with Trinity Street to facilitate carriageway patching, drainage repairs and footway works. The Road A will be temporarily closed (except for pedestrian access); traffic (constituting any class of vehicle) over the Road B shall be temporarily subject to the suspension of the one-way system (westbound) to allow vehicles to travel in both an easterly and westerly direction; the Road C will be temporarily closed (except for pedestrian access); traffic (constituting any class of vehicle) over the Road D shall be temporarily subject to the suspension of the one-way system (eastbound) to allow vehicles to travel in both an easterly and westerly direction; and traffic (constituting any class of vehicle) over the Road E shall be temporarily prohibited to park, stop, load, and/or unload between 09:00 and 16:00 from 9th to 13th March 2026 (may continue until 24th April 2026). Alternative route is via: Road A: Brunswick Street, Union Street, Walpole Street, Vauxhall Street, Chapel Field Road, Convent Road, Unthank Road and Cambridge Street; Road C: Unthank Road, Convent Road, Chapel Field Road, St Stephens Road, Newmarket Road, Brunswick Road and Cambridge Street. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council. **NB: please note that the works will be carried out in two phases within the anticipated dates period. These phases will not be in place at the same time. Phase 1 consists of the restrictions over the Road A, Road B and Road E. Phase 2 consists of the restrictions over the Road C, Road D and Road E.**

DEREHAM ROAD – A) A1074 Dereham Road from its junction with Wendene for 150m eastwards and **B) U78489 Dereham Road** from 27m east of its junction with Breckland Road for 87m eastwards, the Road A will be temporarily closed and the Road B will be subject to a suspension of the bus lane to facilitate remedial works between 19:00 and 06:00 from 9th to 13th March 2026 (may continue until the 24th April 2026). Alternative route is via: Dereham Road U78489 (Norwich, Costessey). The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

EATON STREET- from its junction with Newmarket Road for 106m south-westwards to facilitate the installation of speed cushions between 19:00 and 06:00 from 11th to 13th March 2026 (may continue until 24th April 2026). Alternative route is via: Newmarket Road, Eaton Street, Newmarket Road Slip, Colney Lane, Cringleford Bridge (Cringleford). The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by traffic of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. **Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required.** The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
