

**Norfolk County Council**  
**TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2026 (NORWICH)**  
**Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984**

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) **THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

**BOWTHORPE ROAD** - from 65m southwest of its junction with Dereham Road for 20m south-westwards to facilitate new water connection works between 18:00 on 23<sup>rd</sup> April and 06:00 on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2026 (may continue until 5<sup>th</sup> June 2026). Alternative route is via: Bowthorpe Road, Dereham Road, Guardian Road. The works promoter is Anglian Water.

**MAGPIE ROAD** – from 25m west of its junction with Edward Street to its junction with Edward Street to facilitate carriageway patching works from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2026 (may continue until 4<sup>th</sup> June 2026). Alternative route is via: Magpie Road, Bull Close Road, Charlton Road, St Crispins Road/Barrack Street Roundabout, Charlton Road Bull Close Road, Magpie Road and Edward Street. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

**ST JOHN MADDERMARKET, POTTERGATE, WELLINGTON LANE, ST BENEDICTS STREET – A) St John Maddermarket** from 53m north of its junction with Pottergate for 10m northwards and **B) Pottergate** from its junction with St John Maddermarket to its junction with Wellington Lane and **C) Wellington Lane** from its junction with Pottergate to its junction with St Benedicts Street and **D) St Benedicts Street** from its junction with Wellington Lane for 56m eastwards to facilitate telecoms maintenance works. The Road A will be temporarily closed (except for pedestrian access) and the Roads B–D will be subject to the temporary imposition of a 7.5 tonne weight restriction on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2026 (may continue until 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2026). Alternative route is via: Road A: Lobster Lane, Exchange Street, St Andrews Street. The works promoter is Virgin Media.

(ii) **THEY HAVE MADE** Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

**HELENA ROAD** – from its junction with Dereham Road to its junction with Stafford Street to facilitate lead pipe replacement works from 13<sup>th</sup> April to 15<sup>th</sup> May 2026 (may continue until 15<sup>th</sup> November 2026). Alternative route is via: Stafford Street, Heigham Road, Dereham Road and vice versa. The works promoter is Anglian Water.

**LOBSTER LANE** – from its junction with Pottergate to its junction with Exchange Street to facilitate telecoms ducting works between 09:30 and 15:30 from 14<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> April 2026 (may continue until 27<sup>th</sup> May 2026). Alternative route is via: St John Maddermarket, Duke Street, St Crispins Road, Barn Road, Grapes Hill, Cleveland Road, St Giles Street, Gaol Hill, Exchange Street. The works promoter is BT.

**LOWER CLARENCE ROAD** – from its junction with A1242 Thorpe Road to its junction with A1242 Clarence Road to facilitate parking, loading and unloading of Coaches on 11<sup>th</sup> April 2026 (may continue until 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2026). Coaches carrying away fans attending the Norwich City FC v Ipswich Town FC football match at Carrow Road Stadium will be permitted to enter, park, load and unload on the Road. Alternative route is via A1242 Thorpe Road/Clarence Road. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

**ST LEONARDS ROAD** – St Leonards Road (west side of carriageway only) from 6m south of its junction with Guelph Road to 8m north of its junction with Malvern Road to facilitate trail hole maintenance for upcoming drainage works, traffic (constituting any class of vehicle) over the Road shall be temporarily prohibited to park, stop, load, and/or unload between 07:00 and 16:00 from 16<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> April 2026 (may continue until 29<sup>th</sup> May 2026). Alternative route is via: N/A. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by traffic of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. **Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required.** The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
