

Initial assessments of statutory homelessness duties owed, January to March 2026, England

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This worksheet contains thirteen tables, presented next to each other with one blank row in between each table.

Some cells refer to notes which can be found in a table on the notes worksheet.
Some shorthand is used in this table, [z] = not applicable, [x] = missing, [c] = data suppressed, AST = assured shorthold tenancy, SRS = social rented sector, SH = supported housing, PRS = private rented sector, SRS = social rented sector, NFA = no fixed abode.
The data in these tables is from the worksheets A1 to A13, there is more detailed data available in each individual table, the purpose of this sheet is for oversight of specific national, regional or local authority data on households assessed and owed a homelessness duty.
A drop down menu is available in cells B8 and D8, these filter the corresponding columns data (B and C, and D and E) based on chosen region or local authority. Two area filters are provided to enable easy comparison across between different geographies.
